1	Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 138cms . Riders not to have attained their 16 th birthday prior to 1 st January in the current year.	84cms (2' 8")	£15
2	Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, not exceeding 153cms . Riders not to have attained their 20 th birthday prior to 1 st January in the current year.	107cms (3' 5")	£15

Method of Judging

Each class is split into three phases:

Phase I	Dressage Test	70 Marks
Phase II	Jumping	100 Marks
Phase III	Conformation, Type & Suitability for Eventing	<u>30 Marks</u>

200 Marks Maximum

- Horses/Ponies come into the ring individually and complete phase I – the Dressage Test - then proceed immediately into Phase II - the Jumping Phase, then proceed to Phase III – Conformation.
- There are no set penalties for a pole down or a run out – but three refusals will result in elimination. The jumping course should be a mixture of coloured and rustic obstacles and is designed to produce ten jumping efforts
- Each jumping effort is marked out of 10 at the Judge's discretion
- The first fence must be a small inviting fence and may be jumped as a practice fence – this fence is not to be marked or numbered.
- All horses, unless eliminated, are required to come back without saddles for Phase 111 - conformation assessment to be awarded marks out of a possible 30.
- The Judge does not have to sit at any appointed place for the Dressage Test but may sit at the point they feel most appropriate – according to the design and layout of the arena

RULES FOR THE SOUTH ESSEX INSURANCE BROKERS P(UK) BURGHLEY EVENT PONY

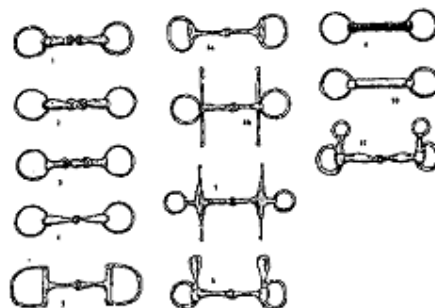
- Classes are open to Members and Non-Members of Ponies (UK).
- Any pony/horse taking the wrong course or jumping another fence after completing the course will be eliminated.
- If a pony/horse turns its quarters to a fence or has a complete turn round, or crosses its tracks on approach to the next fence a refusal will be given.
- Boots (including over-reach boots) are PERMISSIBLE in Phases I and II. AT NO OTHER TIME CAN A CHANGE OF SADDLERY BE PERMITTED.
- Ponies/horses displaying disobedience - mounted or dismounted - during either phase will be eliminated.
- Competitors may walk the course dismounted before their class, correctly dressed.
- The fall of horse and/or rider anywhere on the course will result in elimination. The Rider may not attempt another fence but must leave the arena immediately on foot.
- In the event of equality of marks, the TOTAL mark from Phase Two (Jumping) will take precedence, followed by the Conformation marks. If there is still a tie, the total marks from Phase One (Dressage) will be taken into consideration. If there is still a tie after all three phases, the Judge's decision is final.
- A Judge should be selected from a R, R-Con, P(UK) Competition Panel, any P(UK) Competition Stipendiary Judge, plus a BHSI / Fellow of the BHS or any SHB(GB) Competition Panel Judge may judge the P(UK) Burghley Event Pony classes
- Blunt Spurs may be worn
- Ordinary Snaffle Bridles OR Double Bridles only are permitted – please see diagram below.
- Flash, Drop or Cavesson nosebands only are permitted with a Snaffle Bridle.
- Martingales, Bearing, Side or Running Reins of any kind are NOT permitted.

PERMITTED BITS SOUTH ESSEX INSURANCE BROKERS P(UK) BURGHLEY EVENT PONY

Bits of rubber, nylon or other synthetic materials are permitted.

SNAFFLE BRIDLES

- Ordinary snaffle with double-jointed mouthpiece
- Ordinary snaffle with double-jointed mouthpiece
- Ordinary snaffle with jointed mouthpiece with Lozenge
- Ordinary snaffle with jointed mouthpiece
- Racing snaffle (D Ring)
- Egg-butt snaffle
 - without cheeks
 - with cheeks
- Other types of snaffle with cheeks
- Snaffle with upper cheeks only
- Rubber, leather or plastic snaffle jointed or unjointed

11. Hanging check snaffle or Loose ring hanging snaffle

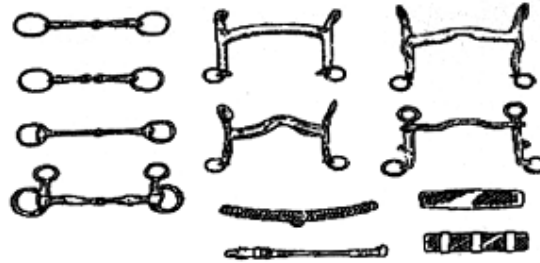
Bits must be used in their manufactured condition without any addition to/on any part. Only the bits that are illustrated are permitted, they may be used with any of the cheeks or rings illustrated.

DOUBLE BRIDLES

Bits should follow the configuration of those illustrated below. Rugby Pelhams are **NOT** permitted.

Various Bridoon Bits:

1. Ordinary bridoon bit
2. Bridoon bit with two joints
3. Egg-butt bridoon bit
4. Bridoon bit with cheeks



Various Curb Bits:

1. Mullen Mouth Bit
2. Ported Curb
3. Curb bit with tongue groove
